This Permit is valid for days shooting, between the dates of Month Day Day Day			
when used for still photography and commercials this Permit is valid only for the regular open hours of the park unless otherwise specified and the after-hours fee is paid. The open hours of the park are from 8:00 a.m. until sundown. The open-hours photography permit fee is \$30.00 per day, plus all applicable admission fees for all persons in the group. The after-hours photography permit fee is \$60.00 per day, plus all applicable admission fees for all persons in the group. The annual permit fee of \$300 covers after hours use. The after-hours fee also entitles the Permittee to photograph in the park during the open hours of the same day for which the after-hours fee has been paid. When used for TV Program and Motion Picture filming the fees will be \$300.00 per day for all days with 10 hours or less of filming and \$600.00 per day for all days with over 10 hours of filming. Fees are due and payable in advance at the park. Permittee must notify the park in advance of each planned use of this permit. This will insure appropriate coordination as to locations and time of the shooting, plus any requested special arrangements. The exact location, within the park, for the filming operation shall be mutually satisfactory with the Park Manager and the Permittee. If mutually agreeable terms cannot be reached, the Park Manager may revoke this Permit.			
The Park Manager, at his/her discretion, may require the Permittee to furnish a guard at the Permittee's expense. The person serving as a guard shall be subject to approval by the Park Manager. Further, the Permittee shall replace the guard upon request by the Park Manager.			
By his/her signature hereon, Permittee attests that this filming operation is covered by a current liability insurance policy with a minimum of \$300,000 combined single limit coverage. Permittee assumes all risks in this operation and agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the State of Florida, its officers and employees from every claim, suit, loss, damage or injury arising out of any operations under this Permit.

Exhibit A

Guidelines for TV and Motion Picture Filming

TV and Motion picture companies will be allowed to film on state park property subject to the following restrictions:

- 1. Permits for TV and motion picture filming will be authorized by the Park Manager.
- 2. Fees for TV and motion picture filming, as listed on the Commercial Photography Permit, will be charged.
- 3. The Division of Recreation and Parks will be reimbursed for any expenses it incurs above normal coordination and monitoring of activities.
- 4. The Permittee will ensure that all of the parks resources and facilities remain in their pre-permit condition throughout the filming process. The Division will be reimbursed for the cost of any repairs it incurs resulting from damage to facilities or resources caused by the filming activities.
- 5. Park resources or facilities will not be altered in any way which would change established resource management schedules or practices, cause permanent damage, shorten the useful life, or reduce the effectiveness or quality of such resources or facilities.
 - a. Adequate safeguards will be implemented to ensure that all animals or plants brought into the park for filming are removed from the park at the conclusion of the permit period.
 - b. No pruning, cutting or breaking of vegetation is permitted.
 - c. No digging, scraping, or other disturbances of the soil is permitted.
- 6. When filming requires the exclusion of park visitors from a park use area, the filming time must be approved by the Park Manager and the duration will be kept to an absolute minimum.
- 7. Security of the set or filming location will be the responsibility of the Permittee.
